The Community Care Car is a nonprofit that offers transportation to Woodland seniors for trips to doctors, dialysis, physical therapy, hair salons, banks, grocery stores, the mall, visits to hospitals, care facilities and to the Senior Center allowing seniors to stay active and independent for a longer time.

Relay for Life Funds are used to support patient services, research, advocacy and community education. Patient services in the community include, but are not limited to: Road to Recovery, which provides free transportation for cancer patients to get to treatment appointments; Look Good, Feel Better, which provides free hair and skin consultations with licensed cosmetologists; and Man to Man and Reach to Recovery, which are prostate and breast cancer support groups, respectively.

Cath Posehn, Executive Director of Yolo Community Foundation said, "We are proud to be creating a lasting resource, committed to building civic investment and
